GLASGOW – The <u>Youth Climate Report</u>, a partner program of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change since 2011, will hold a press conference **Wednesday**, **November 3** at **08:45** in PC2 Durdle Door, East Lomond Suite.

The press conference will present a series of short films representing those made this year from around the world, including four made by Indigenous youth showcasing the impacts of climate change in their Arctic communities.

The press conference will also announce the COP26 premiere of YCR's feature documentary film, The Changing Face of Iceland, made by 20 students from five universities in Canada, the US, and Australia. The COP26 screening will take place on Thursday, November 5 at 16:00 in the Blue Zone: Davos Room (Action Room 1).
